The 77th Annual Library Auction Announces New Chair

The Chair of the Back Mountain Memorial Library Auction for this year is Attorney Tom Mosca. Tom and his wife, Andrea, have lived in the Back Mountain for the past thirty-two years and have been active volunteers for the Auction since Andrea became a member of the Library Board in 2017.



Tom has been practicing law locally for the past thirty-two years. He is a graduate of Wilkes University, and the Catholic University of America, Columbus School of Law. Being involved and volunteering in the community has always been important to Tom. He is active in numerous ministries and committees at St. Therese's Church in Shavertown. Tom is currently the Chair of the NEPA Task Force Against Human Trafficking, Chair of the Luzerne County Accountability, Conduct and Ethics Commission, an Executive Committee Member and Board Member of the Victims Resource Center, and is a Board Member of Dinners for Kids. Tom was also the past President and a Board Member of both the Wyoming Rotary and the Back Mountain Chamber.

Toddler Reading Area

There is a new space especially for our youngest patrons. A beautiful Toddler Reading Area has been dedicated in loving memory of Carol Ripa Oliver. A colorful rug and adult seating outline the perimeter of the space located in the back of the Children’s Wing. Bins holding an extensive selection of board books circle the rug. Toddlers can dig into the bins and have truly immersive early literary experiences.

Young Adult Section

The Young Adult (YA) section contains materials for middle and high school students. Each month, artwork of two local students is displayed.

A gaming chair and other furniture have been added to increase the comfort and functionality of the space. Five different Rubik’s puzzles with solutions guides are available to take home for a bit of a challenge. Manga selections have more than doubled.

Annual Author Luncheon – Sunday, April 30

Barbara J. Taylor to speak at the Back Mountain Library Author Luncheon

The Friends of the Back Mountain Memorial Library will host their 33rd Annual Luncheon with a Special Author on Sunday, April 30th at AppleTree Terrace, Newberry Estate, Dallas. The guest speaker will be Barbara J. Taylor, an author who was born and raised in Scranton, Pennsylvania.

Barbara J. Taylor sets her novels in the hometown she loves and populates them with miners, evangelists, vaudevillians, gangsters, and a prostitute or two. *Publishers Weekly* named her first book, *Sing in the Morning, Cry at Night*, a "Best Book of Summer, 2014," and author Jay Parini called it, "A first-rate debut." Her second novel, *All Waiting Is Long*, received a starred review from *Booklist* and the American Library Association. Taylor is one of Kaylie Jones Books and Akashic Books bestselling authors.



Taylor attended the University of Scranton where she received a BA in English and an MS in education. She taught English in the Pocono Mountain School District for thirty-one years. In the latter part of her career, she returned to graduate school, this time at Wilkes University, and earned an MFA in creative writing. Presently writing full-time, her latest novel, *Rain Breaks No Bones*, the final installment in her Scranton trilogy, is set to be released in 2024, and her personal essay, "Little Miss Know-it-All," will appear in a Best Publishing anthology about Scranton.

The doors will open at 11:30 a.m. and the buffet luncheon will be served at 12:00 noon. All proceeds from the luncheon and the basket raffle will benefit the library.
