Suggested Reading List

The Four Winds by Kristin Hannah

A well-written work of historical fiction and a stirring tale of love and hardship in Dust Bowl-era America. Elsa Wolcott, a woman trying to raise two children on a farm on the Great Plains during the Dust Bowl following the Great Depression, is forced to make an agonizing decision to stay and fight or leave for uncertain lands in the West. A compelling read of courage and sacrifice.

The Kaiser's Web by Steve Berry

The sixteenth book by Steve Berry in the Cotton Malone series. A superb adventure thriller from the mysterious Chilean lake district, to the dangerous mesas of South Africa, and into the secret vaults of Switzerland. Revelations are brought about by the discovery of a secret dossier from World War II-era of a Soviet Spy concerning the fate of Hitler, Braun, and Bormann. This discovery exposes a mystery known as the Kaiser's web.

Revolver: Sam Colt and the six-shooter that changed America by Jim Rasenberger

A riveting and revealing biography of Sam Colt, the inventor of the legendary Colt revolver (a.k.a. six shooter). Colt's gun had a profound effect on American history, impacting the expansionism of the American West and playing an important role in American manufacturing. A lively and informative portrait of a man and America during a time of extraordinary transformation in American history.

Survival of the Thickest by Michelle Buteau

An emotional memoir by comedian and actor Michelle Buteau. In a collection of essays, she reflects on everything from her body image, interracial marriage, difficult road to motherhood and the brave act of learning to love yourself. Funny, insightful, and honest.

Think Again: The power of knowing what you don't know by Adam Grant

Intelligence is usually seen as the ability to think and learn, but in a rapidly changing world, the most critical skill may be the ability to rethink and relearn. Wise, funny, and frank. A book about how to think more clearly and more kindly.

What Could Be Saved by Liese O'Halloran Schwartz

Shocking family secrets are slowly revealed when Laura Preston travels to Bangkok to reunite with her brother, who went missing 40 years earlier. A rich complex novel that shifts between present day Washington, D.C., and 1970's Thailand - the kind of book you can sink into and let time pass.

Super Host by Kate Russo

A deeply funny and shrewdly observed debut novel about being lost in the very place you know by heart. Bennett Driscoll, 55, a Turner Prize-nominated artist who once was a rising star, now is left with no income and must list his house on the popular vacation rental site, AirBed. His art has not sold in two years and the gallery no longer wants to display his work. He struggles to find purpose in his day-to-day existence until the arrival of three guests—lonely American Alicia; tortured artist Emma; and cautiously optimistic divorcee Kristie. A warm, witty, and insightful novel of what can happen when life forces us to take a new chance.

Meet Linda Israel: A Volunteer Worth Her Weight in Gold!

It's been nine years since Linda Israel left her home in New York's Hudson Valley to relocate to the Back Mountain with her husband. Having had a background in teaching and children's libraries, Linda graced the doors of the Back Mountain Memorial Library and quickly became a regular host of children's story hour for ages three to five. She particularly acknowledges her utmost appreciation for our library's active involvement with its patrons and for its wonderful collection of books and programs.



In her volunteer capacity, Linda has used comprehensive planning to create meaningful library experiences for children with a wide variety of books from classics to recently published treasures. Three times each year, she conducted 8-week sessions with up to 15 children in each session while exploring 20 or more book selections. Linda further captures the imagination of children using crafts to connect with the books, which helps to promote reading development skills. She created a Hanakkah story time, complete with dreidels and menorahs, to share her family's traditions. Equally important, Linda works to educate parents by exposing them to high-quality children's literature.

In-person story time came to a screeching halt in March 2020. With new challenges on the horizon as to how to connect children in a similar way as the onsite story hour, Linda made necessary adjustments to fit a visual format including story selections with clear and simple illustrations. Weekly recordings were made for the Summer, Fall, and Winter to Spring series that were released on Facebook complete with pick-up craft kits. A new 4-week series that focuses on hidden gems in the Easy Reader section is going to air this spring. Summer planning is already taking place in whatever format is possible at that time.

Linda Israel is one passionate lady who loves children, children's books, and planning children's programs. What she misses more than anything is being with the children in-person, "Reading is much more difficult without feedback from the children!" The library is especially grateful for the priceless contribution Linda has provided over the years. Her flexibility and enthusiasm during the challenges of this past year have been extraordinary. Thank you, Linda!
